

Dear Parents and Carers,

Across the federation we have been reviewing behaviour and we will be implementing a few changes to support our ethos of Challenge, Achieve, Respect and Enjoy.

We are adopting a key positive behaviour system called six strands, which looks at boundaries, resilience, focus, respect, self-regulation, and independence. These strands come together to allow the children to develop their skills for life and to grow into well-rounded people. Each of these strands are broken down into small, achievable targets. (See the attached grid) This is also broken down further into different age groups: Reception, Key Stage 1 and Key Stage 2, making them age-appropriate challenges.

Each week we will be choosing one section to focus on. In assemblies and class we will be unpicking what it means, how we can achieve it and the children will be trying their best to put it into practise. Watch out in our newsletter and on Facebook for the strand we are focusing on each week. These will be rewarded with house points as well as sharing some of our achievements in assemblies.

We strive to focus on the positive achievements of the children, however, it is vitally important for children to also have clear rules to work to. Therefore, to go along side this, we are also setting high behavioural expectations. With all expectations, they are non-negotiable and will be followed up with the predetermined consequences. This is a clear system which will allow the children to know what is expected of them and what happens should they not do this.

This will be adopted by the whole school as from Monday and all staff will be embracing the same system. We ask that you help and support your children by asking them about the focus of the week and celebrating their achievements as well as reinforcing the behaviours that are expected and supporting the consequences.
